While our physical doors are currently closed, we are still here for you in these uncertain times. We are here to connect with you, to share London's stories and to listen to your story.

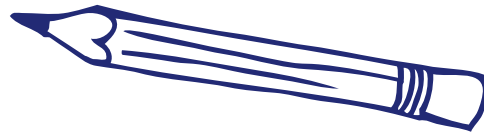
We hope our packs will bring joy and keep us connected. These packs form part of our Memories of London programme, designed for people affected by dementia.

It could be anyone – your teen idol, a good friend or even a Prime Minister...



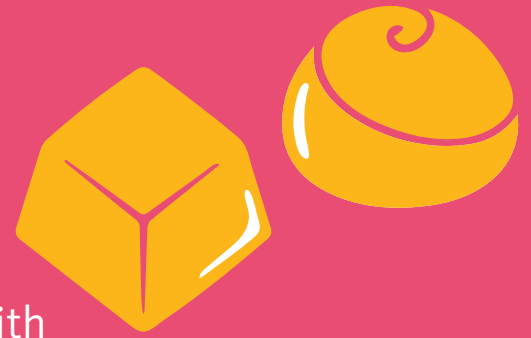
What music would you play?

GET ARTY!



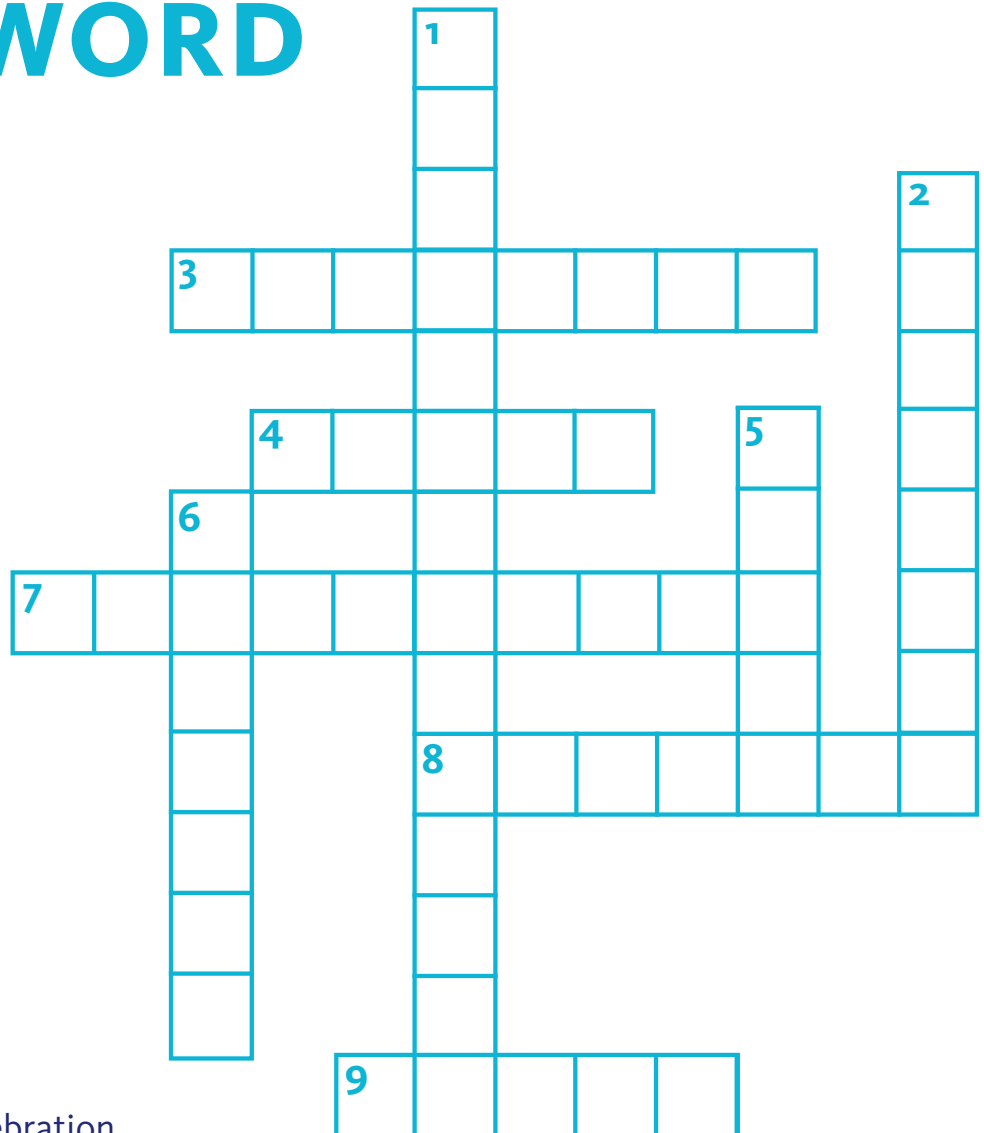
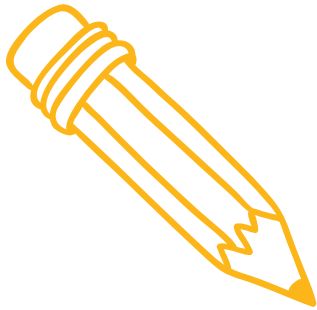
On 2 June 1953, communities across London and the world, celebrated the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II. Street parties were held with food entertainment and decorations.

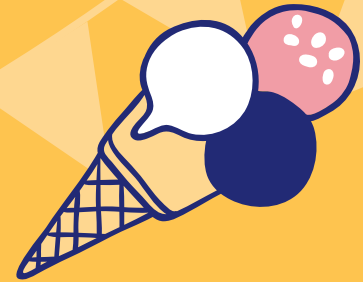
This photo was taken at a children's party in 1970. Can you write a story using the photo as inspiration?

Are they enjoying the food and drink?



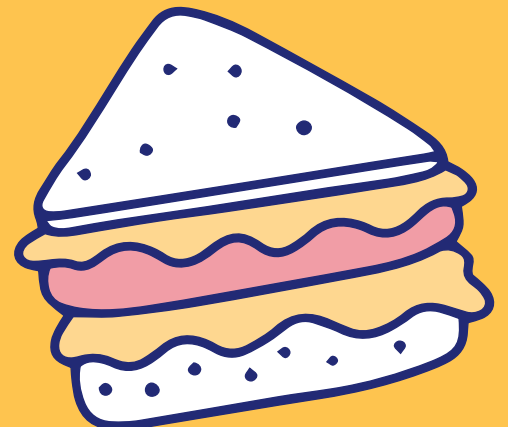
SMELL TOUCH AND TASTE

You could play this a game with others, or simply try it on your own.

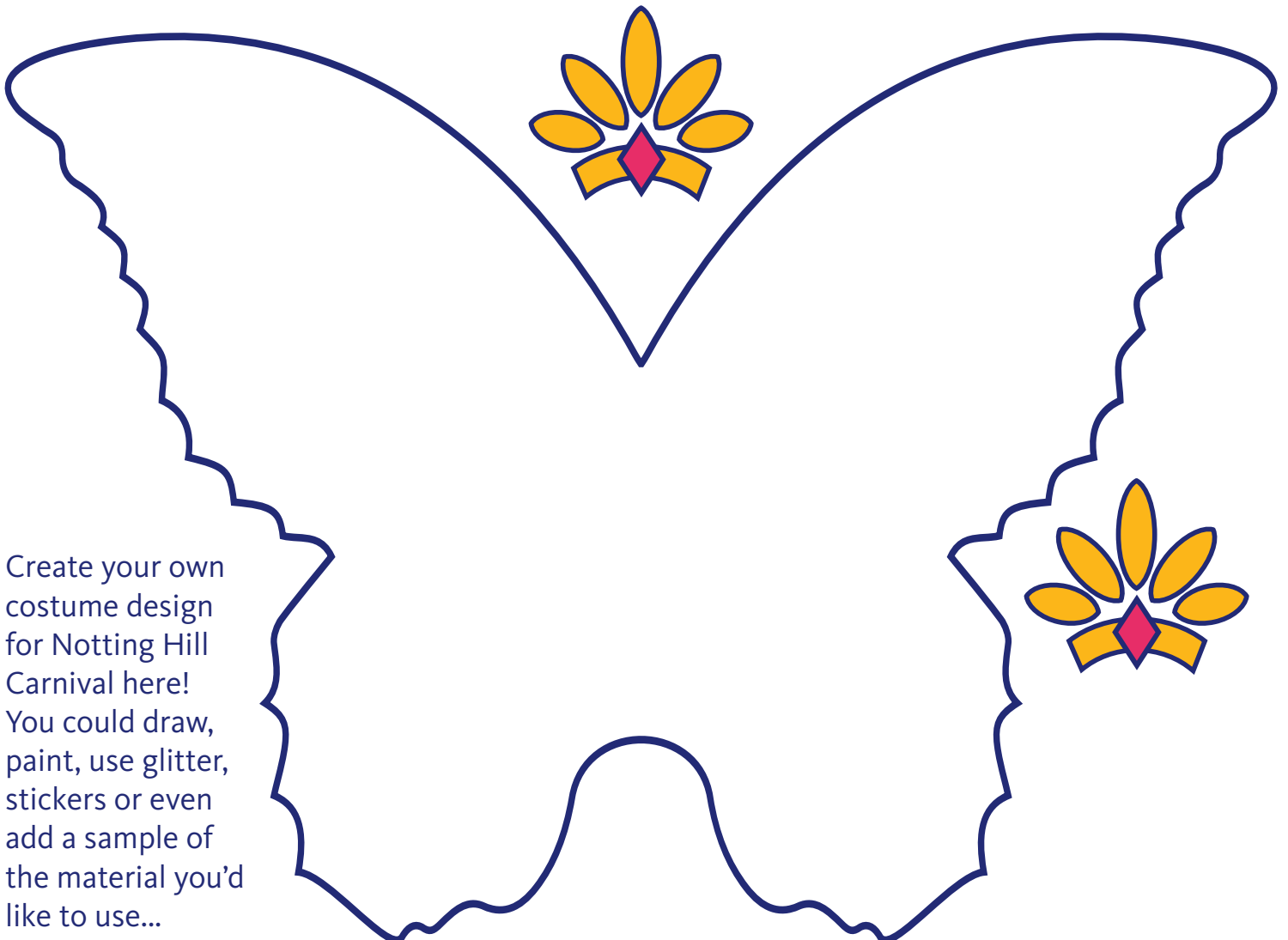




CREATE AND MAKE

Notting Hill Carnival, 1997

Notting Hill Carnival is an incredible procession and celebration held each August on the streets of the Ladbroke Grove area of London. In 1959, Activist Claudia Jones, held a Caribbean Carnival in St Pancras Town Hall. It aimed to show solidarity and strength in the growing Caribbean community. Inspired by its success Notting Hill Carnival grew and in 1966 the first street festival was held.
