What will be covered?

This session will provide an introduction to making basic videos within the setting of a museum or gallery. This hands-on training session will offer participants the basic skills needed to create their own video content using their own devices; from mobile phones, to tablets, to cameras. The afternoon will give an introduction to editing this footage using free software. By the end of the session, participants will be inspired to make and perform basic editing on their own video content.

PLEASE NOTE: It would be beneficial for those attending to bring the equipment that they plan to use for capturing and creating videos within their own institution. You will also need to download a free copy of [HitFilm Express](#) – by scrolling to the bottom of the webpage and following the steps.

We will be providing refreshments, but please do bring your own lunch. You are also welcome to use the Museum cafe, on site. There are also a number of shops around the area, including a Pret and a Tesco.
