What will be covered?

All museums need to take account of users' needs. This practical course will enable a museum to understand the process and undertake an Access Audit, which will be used to inform their Access Policy, meeting the standards required of Accreditation. This workshop will cover the basics of Disability Confidence including; common perceptions, understanding the Social Model of Disability, disability etiquette and an overview of the Equality Act. What makes an effective Access Audit, using the 'Four Access Questions' and an Access Checklist will be looked into. There will also be an opportunity to conduct an Access Audit, using the Museum of London as an example. Finally, Access law and what reasonable adjustments can be made will be explored.

This training session will be led by Goss Consultancy. They are well regarded in the Arts and Heritage sector and work with organisations to ensure that they as diverse, accessibke and inclusive as possible in the way they employ people, develop policies and deliver services. We are also pleased to have Stagetext, who will be presenting about their offer. Stagetext is a registered charity which provides captioning and live subtitling services to theatres and other arts venues to make their activities accessible to people who are d/Deaf, deafened or hard of hearing.

All staff, volunteers and Trustees, who are responsible for carrying out an Access Audit and composing the Access Policy in their museum.
