It will equip you to confidently organise an online session with safeguarding in mind, whilst offering some tips to stay safe and protect children and young people in the digital space.

The UK Safer Internet Centre is the national awareness centre and forms part of the European Commission's, Safer Internet Programme and part of the European Insafe network. They have been at the forefront of online safety for the past two decades, delivering engaging presentations to a wide variety of audiences nationally and internationally. Experts from SWGfL advise schools, public bodies and industry on appropriate actions to take in regards to safeguarding and advancing positive online safety policies. Boris is an expert speaker in the field of online safety. He has been working with the European Commission, TAIEX instrument to present the topic of online safety to government officials, NGOs and stakeholders as well as presenting as a keynote speaker at European conferences on the topics of new and emerging trends and applications being used by children and youth online. He is also a member of the Trust and Safety board at Twitter and has advised governments on creating and adopting Online child safety policies and best practices.
